



The Wizard of Oz Performance FAQ

Will everyone be required to wear a mask?

Yes, unless they are medically unable. Patrons will be allowed to remove their mask only when eating or drinking, or when outdoors if fully vaccinated. Performers will wear clear face shields.

How many people will attend?

In Phase 3, indoor venues are limited to 50% capacity or 400 people, whichever is less. The capacity of the performance space is 800, so we can have up to 400 people in the space. We will have ~50 cast/crew, so we will be selling up to 350 tickets for each performance. In the unlikely event Chelan County is moved back to Phase 2, we will adjust accordingly.

How will you spread people out?

Patrons will be seated with their ticket-purchase-group in alternating rows. Here's an example, where the "x" indicates an empty seat.

Row 1: Row 1: 3 people icons, 2 empty seats (x), 2 people icons, 3 empty seats (x), 4 people icons.
Row 2: Row 2: 4 empty seats (x), 2 people icons, 2 empty seats (x), 3 people icons, 5 empty seats (x).

How will seats be assigned?

Tickets that are purchased in the same transaction will be seated together—this is your ticket-purchase-group. If you wish to purchase tickets for multiple people/groups who will not be seated together, please do so in separate transactions.

Seats will be assigned in the order they are purchased based on the best available seats in the section selected (floor or mezzanine). Check in at the concierge desk in the lobby for your seat assignment and an usher will escort you to your seats.

What if I have special needs?

Please indicate any special needs, including handicap seating or the need for more physical distance, in the space provided during your ticket purchase.

Will there be concessions and intermission?

Yes, we will have an intermission as well as indoor and an outdoor concession spaces.
